Door Medam:

I am returning for your files the letter which Fr. Sweetser wrote you under date of October 14th with regard to the status of Abbio G. Snow who holds a salesman's license, based upon her employment with her impland who has recently died.

While the statutes under which your Board operates does not definitely provide for a situation created when a licensed broker dies, the whole basis of a saleman's license seems to be employment by a licensed broker. Section 7, Chapter 85, Fublic Laws of 1937, provides that on the revocation of a broker's license, the licenses of every saleman granted to any person by virtue of his employment by the broker whose license has been revoked, is automatically suspended pending a new employment, and the last peragraph of that same Section seems to indicate that a saleman cannot hold a license when he is not employed by a broker.

If Wrs. Snow wishes to continue her husbands business, she can incorporate it and get a broker's license for the corporation and a salesmen's license for herself and her other salesmen.
