Dear Sir:

I am enclosing application of Joseph A. Fournier for a funeral director's certificate of registration.

In order to ascertain whether or not he is entitled to a certificate under the provisions of Section 31A of Chapter 243, Public Laws of 1939, it would be proper for you to learn the facts in this particular case. It seems to me that, in order to entitle him to a certificate, it would be necessary for him to be actively engaged as a funeral director. The fact that he acted as funeral director while working for someone else, and only occasionally acted for and in place of his employer would not, in my opinion, be sufficient to entitle him to qualify under this section.
