I have your letter of February 7th, enclosing copy of a letter from J. Norton Ijans bearing date of January 11, 1941. It seems to me that the letter contains sufficient information so that it should not be very difficult to track the case down.

If the New York Young Men's Christian Association is willing to pay the actual disbursements in having a search made, and a reasonable amount for attorneys' fees, provided anything is found and recoverable, I am very certain that I could name several young lawyers here in the State, any one of whom would be glad to tackle the job and would be competent to handle it.

Lest that suggestion of disbursement prove frightening, I imagine that a maximum of \$20 to \$25 ought to take care of all expenses in connection with the development of the evidence.
