Gentlemen:

Your inquiry, relative to the right of the State officers to serve processes and make arrests on military reservations, I have to inform you that a general answer cannot be given. It will depend on whether or not the State deeded the property to the Federal Government without reservation.

In some Government reservations the control of the Government is exclusive. In others, certain rights of the State are reserved.

Should you specify the reservation to which you refer, I may be able to give you a definite answer as to the State's right to enter upon such reservations for the service of process and making arrests.
