I have your memo of July 28th. I believe we have gone just as far as we should in liberal interpretation of Chapter 202 of the Public Laws of 1941. I believe it would be unwise to go any further. I doubt if there are any appreciable number of cases where the parties will be seriously embarrassed by requiring the blood test here in Maine if they are unable to find physicians "duly licensed to practice in the State of Maine", in their own states.

If any persons are embarrassed by the law, it certainly would be as a result of their own conduct.
