In re Proceedings in the Supreme Judicial Court in Equity - City of Auburn v. Colonial Beacon Oil Company and George E. Hill, and City of Auburn v. George E. Hill, involving payment by municipalities of gasoline tax and tax on fuel oil for diesel engines to the State of Maine

In confirmation of our telephone conversation in which you stated that you would waive your request for a temporary injunction, provided no rights of the City of Auburn will be jeopardized by such a waiver, I give you my assurance that in so far as this office is concerned there will be no loss of any rights to the City by your refraining from pressing your request for a temporary injunction. This letter may be accepted in lieu of a formal stipulation in that regard.
