Doar Judge:

In response to your inquiry of October 30th, relative to claim of the State v. Town of Connor, I am pleased to inform you that we are of the opinion that the claims you cention are justly due the State in proference to other exeditors who extended credit to the town when it was above the constitutional debt limit.

With reference to "paupers in sanatoriums" I refer you to Chapter 270, P. L. 1933, Special Session December 4 to 20.

Regarding "snow reloval", see Sections 52 to 61 of Chapter 26, R. S., as amended by Chapter 231, P. L. 1931, by Chapter 149, P. L. 1935, and by Chapters 162 and 231 of P. L. 1937.

As to "Mother's aid for dependent children" and "board and care of neglected children", see P. L. 1933, Chapter 1, Sections 201 to 213.

I have been informed that the law with reference to nearly all of the above is to be decided in the Van Buren case now pending.
