In re Surety Bonds for lost or destroyed checks.

I have your memo of Hovember 18th, signed also by Belmont Smith, State Treasurer.

Inamuch as the bond is for the personal protection of the State Treasurer, it seems to me wise that he should continue to require it. If he issued a substitute speck in place of one reported lost or destroyed, and through any error of the bank or otherwise the original clock got through and was paid, there will be a strong likelihood of the State Treasurer being personally liable.
