**In re Oath on Expense Accounts**

Although the customary and, in most cases, the only proper method of taking a jurat is by having the oath taken before a Notary Public or a Justice of the Peace who records the fact that the oath is taken before him, the form of expense account now being used and filed, is a sworn statement which complies with the provisions of the statute.
