To Henry P. Weaver, Chief, Maine State Police
Re: Retirement, Pension not Being Available Immediately

With reference to your inquiry relative to the Retirement System under the provisions of Section 233-A, Chapter 225, P. L. 1939, we do not find any legal objection, if a police officer has served for twenty years with a good record, to his requesting in writing to the Chief that he be retired from active service without pension, and receiving the pension to which he is entitled by reason of service when there is a vacancy on the pension list. Provided, however, that not more than 10% of the entire active strength of the force shall be carried on the retired list at any one time.
