Lear Bir:

I have your letter of May 18th in regard to fireworks. Fearestrully call your attention to the definition of fireworks contained in Recetor's Dictionary and in other dictionaries.

The Twentive Order in reject to fireworks was intended to apply to all loud noise-making implements of an explosive nature and all such things as firmer candles, flares, recipts and other objects which, in common language, are included in the word "fireworks". The use or sale of such hurning or explosive objects is expressly forbidden by the Order.

Cap pistals alone, of the sort that use a tarriess charical for the emplosive element, have been excepted from the Order by interpretation of this office.
