Subject: Possibility of counting service rendered as teacher and principal of Eastern Maine Conference Seminary toward one's membership in the Maine Teachers' Retirement Association.

Reference is to your memorandum of November 18, 1942, addressed to Attorney General Frank I. Cowan.

On the basis of the facts stated in your memorandum, it is the opinion of this department that there is no basis, under the provisions of the statutes relative to the Maine Teacher's Retirement Association, to permit counting service in the Eastern Maine Conference Seminary toward membership in said Association.

The school in question is not a public school and is not an academy which has contract relations with a town.
