To Joseph H. McGillicuddy, Treasurer of State Re: Bonds, Duties of Deputy Attorney General

In reply to your memorandum relative to the recent sale of Agricultural Bonds, Issue of February 1, 1943, your attention is called to Section 83 of Chapter 91., Revised Statutes of 1930, which reads in part as tollows:

"The attorney-general shall appoint a deputy attorney-general, who shall serve during the pleasure of the attorney-general or until a successor is duly appointed and qualified. His office shall be at the capital and he may perform all the duties required of the attorney-general by chapter fifty-six, and such other duties as the attorney-general may require of him. ."

The preparing and signing of the Agricultural Bonds, Issue of February 1, 1943, was a duty required of the deputy attorney-general by the attorney-general; and for a period of years, bond issue opinions have been signed by the deputy.
