Bill in Equity, City of Eastport.

In your memorandum of March 2nd, on the above subject, you ask two questions in connection with unsettled claims against said City of Eastport.

It is the opinion of this department:

1. That it is possible that the City of Eastport may be sued in an effort to collect unsettled claims which were not filed with the Master, pending the acceptance of the Master's report by the Court and the final disposition of the bill in equity.

2. That the city will be relieved of any responsibility in connection with these claims either by carrying the bill in equity through to final conclusion or by settling the claims at the present time.
