Dear Sir:-

This will acknowledge receipt of yours of March 19th in regard to the sum of money raised at town meeting toward the repair of the grange hall.

This department cannot render official advice or opinions except to the various departments of the State government in connection with State business.

However, unofficially, since from the facts stated in your letter it appears that this building is used to conduct the town affairs, it would not seem to be out of order for your town to raise a sum of money to keep the building in such condition that it may be used for town purposes. It is assumed that you have no building owned by the town which could be used for these purposes.
