Women's Reformatory

In answer to your inquiry dated March 26th, regarding the policy of handling confinement cases outside the Reformatory, there is no provision for this method of handling these cases as you have outlined under the wording of our statutes.

The statutes provide for the removal of prisoners in the event of contagious diseases.

The Court having jurisdiction of the case could authorize the removal of a prisoner, but without such an authorization it would not be proper for any other official to remove her from this institution.
