Dear Madam:-

I am returning to you herewith your letter from McLean, Southard & Hunt, asking for "a complete record in the case of Eunice Edna McLean," etc. Of course, we try to cooperate with the attorneys in so far as we can, but there are certain matters in these regards that may be confidential. There is no duty on your part to comply with such requests. On the other hand, there is no objection to your disclosing to the attorney (who is, after all, an officer of the court) such matters as (1) are not confidential, and (2) will not possibly involve you in an action for libel or slander.
