Military Leave

This will acknowledge your memorandum of April 28th, relative to one of your officers who was enlisted, July 20, 1942, and reports to the army for induction on May 5, 1943.

In reply to your question as to whether there is any way military leave can be granted at this time, it is the opinion of this department that such leave cannot be granted. As you state in your memorandum, Chapter 314, P. L. 1939, requires one year's service, and Chapter 300, P. L. 1943, which lowers the period of service to six months, is not effective until July 9, 1943.
