Waiver of Fee for Registration of Emergency Teachers

Under the provisions of Section 160, Chapter 19, R. S. 1930, an application for registration as a candidate for employment as a teacher in the public schools must be accompanied by the fee required by said section.

It is understood that, during the present war emergency, teachers are very difficult to obtain and that there is a possible source of teacher material among persons qualified who would be willing to serve as teachers to help out in the emergency. These persons are not candidates for employment as teachers, but are willing to make themselves available, if needed, to help out under existing conditions.

It is the opinion of this department that the Department of Education in the present emergency may properly set up a list of such persons, aside from the list contemplated by Section 160, Chapter 19, R. S. 1930, and that it would not be necessary to require any fee from the persons whose names might be placed on such a list.
