Dear Sir:-

Your letter of June 15th, addressed to Attorney General
Frank I. Corbin, has been received.

It is the opinion of this department that you are correct
in your interpretation of Chapter 53, P. L. 1942, which amends the
local option provisions in regard to Sunday movies, as created by
Chapter 255, P. L. 1939. The provisions of Chapter 53 seem clear that
the vote must be at an annual town meeting.

Chapter 245, P. L. 1933, does, however, seem to allow a
vote on the question of Sunday baseball at a special town meeting.
