I note the copy of your letter to Mr. Marshall bearing date February 24th and having to do with the time for filing libels. I trust Mr. Marshall will be able to answer this question in a manner that will be of assistance to the Fish and Game Department. However, I must warn you that on some of these matters, the Attorney General's office can simply give the best opinions available and that there are no hard and fast rules.
