To Daniel T. Malloy, Chief Warden, Inland Fisheries and Game From Frank I. Cowan, Attorney General

I note the copy of your letter to Mr. Marshall bearing date February 24th and having to do with the time for filing libels. I trust Mr. Marshall will be able to enswer this question in a manner that will be of assistance to the Fish and Game Department. However, I must warn you that on some of these matters, the Attorney General's office can simply give the best opinions available and that there are no hard and fast rules. When the legislature has not set a specific time in which a thing must be done, there will always be differences of opinion as to when it should be done.
