We have been asked for a ruling with regard to Chapter 355, §2, Laws of 1943, now Chapter 126, §22, R. S. 1944, which provides that the application for a Beano license shall bear the consent of the municipal officers. The Chairman of the Bangor City Council has inquired whether a certificate of the City Council certifying that the municipal officers have taken favorable action and have given their consent would be a sufficient compliance with the statute which provides that the application "shall bear the consent of the municipal officers of the town or city." We think that such a certificate would comply with this provision.
