Dear Mr. Haskell,

I received your letter of June 10th stating that the Research Committee would appreciate a memorandum from me, indicating . whether of not a Legislative Order has the legal effect of superseding a statute relating to wages to legislative employees.

In reply I wish to state that legislative employees' salaries fixed by statute can be increased by joint orderoof the Legislature; but it is only a temporary expedient and does not have the binding force of law and does not change the statutory provisions. It merely enlarges a statutory provision, which is within the legislative prerogative.

The Legislature is the superior power in the State which is a law-making power; and it has the right to pass acts, resolutions and orders modifying said acts, at its own pleasure. It is my opinion that any order providing for a dalary in excess of the established statutory salary for employees of the Legislature at the last session is valid.
