Subject: Tax on Township 1, R.13, W.E.L.S.: Heirs of Minnie Ross Holman

I received your memo of July 25th, calling my attention to the suspense account of \$342.63, Wild Land Tax, which was allocated to Piscataquis County under the method of distributing the funds received in settlement of the so-called Ross matter, wherein the legislature authorized the Forest Commissioner to convey said property for a certain sum. Your question is:

"Shall we send the \$342.63 to Piscataquis County or reallocate the amount received in settlement of the taxes in order to credit the \$342.63 to state accounts?"

In answer to your question it is my opinion that you should reallocate the amount received in settlement of the taxes, as the County of Piscataquis has received its taxes in full, according to correspondence which is on file in this office.
