Qualifying Bond of Henry E. Packard, of Norway, as a Licensed Detective.

The subject of your inquiry relates to Bond No. 59914, in the sum of \$500.00, furnished by the Maine Bonding and Casualty Company in which said company joins as surety with Henry E. Packard as principal.

This bond is a qualifying bond executed pursuant to the provisions of law relating to the appointment of licensed detectives, the said Packard having been appointed by Governor Sewall as a licensed detective on May 15, 1943. This appointment was made under the provisions of c. 142, §17, R. S. 1930 (c.132, §14, R.S.1944) and the appointment is for 4 years unless said license is sooner revoked for cause.

A bond that is furnished by a person to qualify for an office continues for the term of the office. Such is the case here and, therefore, the liability of the bond of the surety would continue from May 15, 1943 until the expiration or other termination of the term of that office.
