To Dr. Mitchell, Secretary  
Board of Embalming Examiners

I have your memo of February 8th, inquiring whether the Board of Embalming Examiners and Funeral Directors may by regulation provide for preparation other than what is specifically provided for in the statute before an applicant is permitted to submit to the Board of Examiners to practise embalming for examination.

It seems to me that Section 187 of Chapter 22 is very explicit as to the training, preliminary education, schooling in a college of embalming and funeral directing, and the Board would not be authorized to provide for additional training or studies. If there is to be any change, it must be done through the legislature.
