To E. W. Campbell, Director Public Health

In your memo of July 3, 1946, you inquire whether it is necessary to give notice by gublication of at least ten days, where the Board in its discretion holds examinations additional to those provided in Section 216 of Chapter 22.

The provisions of the statute are that the Board shall hold two public examinations each year, one on the first Tuesday of June and one on the first Tuesday of December, at such places as it shall designate. Then follows the provision that add tional examinations may be held at the discretion of the Board. The statute further provides for notice of <u>all</u> examinations by publication at least ten days before the holding of such examination in at least 2 daily newspapers printed and published in the county in which such examination is held.

The statute is very clear and explicit that notice by publication must be given of all examinations.
