October 16, 1947 Brancis J. McCabe, Warden Maine State Prison Thomaston, Maine Dear Warden McCabe, I have your letter of October 7th, relative to Charles E. Nash, asking what you are to do with \$40.10 in cash, which you are holding, and a State check, dated October 1, payable to Charles E. Nash Estate, in the amount of \$38.50. You ask whether you should turn them over to the father of the deceased, Charles S. Nash. You also advise that there be no administrator appointed upon this estate. I think that if the brothers and sisters will join in a request to you that you turn the funds over to his father and that they will indemnify you for any loss sustained by you by reason thereof, in the event that an administrator upon his estate is appointed, then in view of the small amount involved, I would advise that you turn the cash and check over to his father.
