To Arthur R. Savage, Secretary, Maine State Board of Architects
Re: Out-of-State Architect

. . . The preparation of plans in a foreign State and the signing of such plans as "architect" by a person in that State, for work to be done in Maine, would not violate our law regulating the practice of architecture.

Such person, however, I believe, would be violating the law if he undertook to superintend the job in this State.
