To Major Joseph Young, Deputy Chief, Maine State Police

Referring to our conversation this morning concerning the Comet Flying Club, which Judge Cote states in his letter of October 27th to you is having its name changed to the Androscoggin Athletic Association, which change of name would be instituted under Section 3 of Chapter 50, R. S. 1944:-

This would not affect the time that the club has been in existence, as it was incorporated without capital stock and was organized for social and educational purposes for the promotion and teaching of aviation in the State of Maine.

It appears to me, after reading the facts contained in Judge Cote's letter, to be proper for the club to petition for a permit to play beano, under the Beano Statute.
