Re: Use of Maine Woods for Training Purposes

In response to your telephone call of 6/22/51, in which you submitted an inquiry concerning an experiment by which several soldiers would be permitted to enter the woods and violate our fish and game laws, thereby giving the soldiers practical tests in their training to "live off the land," please be advised that no provision exists in our laws authorizing the Attorney General to grant permission. . . .
