To Honorable Frederick G. Payne, Governor of Maine  
Re: Cemetery Care

. . . It appears that in the case of unincorporated communities care of cemetery lots can be taken by the county commissioners.

In cities and towns the only provision for their care appears to be that such is provided by money held in trust for such purpose, and the cities and towns are not by law required to keep up the care of such cemetery lots except in the case of veterans of our wars. . .

Chapter 66 of the Laws of 1949 is the latest word in the matter.
