To Roland H. Cobb, Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game Re: Archery Licenses.

In your memo of October 1, 1952, you stated that the the archery licenses issued under the provisions of sections 96-A et seq. there has been stamped: "Expires December 31st". You then asked, "Can this license be used during the regular open season - after the special season is overt"

The answer to your question is, No.
While generally all licenses and permits issued by your deparament expire at midnight on December 3lat of the calendar year in which the licenses and permits were issued, section 122 of Chapter 33 further provides that the license or permit shall exvire on December 3lst, unless the license or permit specifically provides otherwise.

Under section 96-A the archery season expires on October 15 th. Section 96-B provides that'if a person does take a deer with bow and arrow during the special season, he is precluded from further hunting for deer during that year. The last sentence of this seczion states that if a person does not take a deer he is not presclouded from obtaining a hunting license for the regular season.

We think the law clearly states that the archery licensed expires on October 15 th and if the person in possession of such a Incense has not obtained a deer by that date, he must obtain a regular hunting license if he desires to hunt beyond October 15th.
