Re: Partnership

We are returning to you, without the approval of this office certificate of organization of a corporation, in the first paragraph of the purposes of which we note the words to "enter into a partnership".

With respect to the right of a corporation to become a partner with an individual or another corporation your attention is drawn to 13 Am. Jur. 830, section 823.

The principle there stated has been followed, at least in some courts in this state, as the undersigned has heard a Superior Court Justice charge that, as a matter of law, a corporation may not enter into a partnership with another corporation.

It is for these reasons that your certificate is being returned to you for a consideration of this matter. . .
