To E. B. Reed, Jr., State Board of Embalming Examiners
Re: Special Examinations

. . . You inquire if there is any law to prohibit you from giving more than two examinations during the course of a year.

Section 189 of Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes reads as follows;

"Examinations for licenses shall be given by the board at least twice a year, at such times and places as it may determine."

We interpret this sentence to make it mandatory upon you to give at least two examinations each year. There is nothing in the statutes that would prohibit the Board's giving more than two examinations at times and places to be determined by the Board.
