To Roland H. Cobb, Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game  
Re: Physical Examinations for Pilots

Please forgive our belated reply to yours of October 22, 1953, in which you ask if the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game has "the authority to pay for complete physical examinations, including cardiograph, of our flying Wardens."

Your question arises because of a memo to you from Harlan Harris in which it is stated that a \$10 fee for a cardiogram is not a reimbursable item, so far as the employee is concerned, because the Aeronautics Commission does not require physical examinations of employees who operate State planes.

We regret that we are unable to answer your question; but we feel that rather than being a question of law, the matter involves a question of policy and is of an administrative nature.
