Fortier, Chairman, Maine Employment Security Commission Re: Due Date of Reports We have your memo relative to the contribution due date and filing of payroll records and the attached opinion of John G. Marshall, then Deputy Attorney General, dated November 4, 1943, interpreting the sections of law with respect to such contribution due date and filing of payroll records. It will be the duty of the attorney assigned to yourooffice to enforce the collection of defaults committed by any of the employers, and we are therefore requesting that the attorney who will be impressed with this duty write the opinion requested by you. We will be pleased, after such opinion is written, to confer with the writer on the matter. It would appear to our office that the enforcement problem with which you are faced is one of the major problems of your office. For this reasons we feel that the attorney who must enforce your laws should be fully aware of all the background in any instance where he will be compelled to take action of any kind under your laws.
