... When it appears that an applicant is dealing in trailers of the nature of that defined under the term "semi-trailer", as found in Section 1 of Chapter 22, R. S. 1954, then we feel that this applicant should be granted dealer plates.

When the applicant deals in trailers as defined by the word "trailer" found in Section 1 of Chapter 22, R. S. 1954, we feel that this applicant should be granted transit plates, so called.

There is an obvious conflict between the terms of Section 26 and Section 26-A of Chapter 22. We trust that the Board will see fit to offer an amendment at the next legislative session in order to clarify the apparent conflict. A suggestion might be that the word "trailer" found in Section 26 be changed to "semi-trailer".
