To S. F. Dorrance, Livestock Specialist, Agriculture Re: Claims for Boarding Dogs

. . . You ask if you have the right under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 140, R. S. 1954, to approve dog boarding claims on Maine dogs taken across the line, accepted and cared for by New Hampshire licensed veterinarians.

We are of the opinion that you may not approve claims for Maine dogs that have been taken out of the State. The statute above referred to states that when a dog is taken to any licensed veterinarian within the State, he may accept the same. Then in such event the bill would be justified.
