We have your memorandum of May 7, 1957, which asks the following question:

"When a renewal license is received with a different place of business from that shown on last year's application and we have not been notified of the change, is it necessary to require a new application and an original fee, OR are we within the law to accept the renewal blank and renewal fee?"

We feel that you are within the law by accepting the renewal blank and renewal fee rather than requiring an original fee. We feel that you may accept the new application with the new address as notification by the licensee of his change in his place of business.
