To Major General George M. Carter, The Adjutant General Re: Uniform Code of Military Justice

Having had occasion recently to consider the Uniform Code of Military Justice in the light of its applicability to courts—martial for the National Guard of this State, I am inclined to the view that the needs of the National Guard could be better served and a number of worthwhite improvements in the administration of military justice for the National Guard not in federal service could be provided by a State Code of Military Justice.

Certain definite advantages in the adoption by the States of a Uniform State Military Justice Code, to be patterned on the Uniform Code of Military Justice, occur to me and prompt the suggestion that such a code might well be a proper subject for consideration by the Commissioners of Uniform State Laws.
