To. Doris M. St. Pierre, Secretary, Real Estate Commission Re: Col. Ralph M. Manter

Section 5 of Chapter 84 of the Revised Statutes of 1954 makes specific requirements for application for real estate brokerage license. These requirements must be satisfied before the Commission can issue a license.

In the case of Col. Manter, he must get the recommendation of three citizens who have known him for three years and have owned real estate for one year in the county in which the applicant resides, or similar recommendations from three persons with like qualifications from any county where the applicant has resided for three years prior to the filing of his application.

It is my opinion that Col. Manter, if not able to satisfy these requirements, cannot be given a license by the Commission.
