Children on Federal Reservations

Chapter 41
Residence in general is defined by Section 44 as the administrative unit where the father maintains a home for his family. Section 163 provides for schooling of children on a government reservation. Please refer to memorandum of February 5, 1957, by James Glynn Frost, Deputy Attorney General re "Children of Military Personnel".

In regard to the memorandum of June 4, 1943, written by Attorney General Cogan, I can see no statutory enactment which would alter the conclusion contained therein. I assume that the federal government still provides payments in lieu of taxes.
