Dear Harvey:

Relative to your inquiry of the amendments to the Revised Statutes of 1954, Chapter 10, Section 7, Legislative Document No. 1203, it is my opinion that the striking out of the word "service" in the third line of that bill and the adding of the words "through the State Bureau of Purchases, arrange for necessary service," would require you to arrange for services, which would include printing, outside the State Bureau of Purchases. It is my understanding that at this time you do arrange for your printing service through the Bureau.

The balance of the amendment seems clear enough by simply adding more to your duties.
