Dear Chat:

In answer to your inquiry as to whether or not by legislative order you as Secretary to the Senate could be authorized to have certain custody and control as specified in the Revised Statutes of 1954, Chapter 10, Section 7, it is my opinion that that could be done by Joint Order but not by Senate Order alone.

This would not pertain, however, to the last sentence of the bill which states that "The clerk shall maintain a perpetual inventory of all legislative property and make an accounting to the Legislature upon request."
