This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of January 6, 1960, in which you ask as to whether or not the sale of money orders violates section 4 of chapter 59, Revised Statutes of 1954.

It is our opinion that selling money orders is not embraced by the provisions of section 4, chapter 59, which section defines the business of banking.
