Mileage Paid Employees Inspecting Potatoes

We have your memo of May 16, 1960 which reads as follows:

"Request is hereby made for an interpretation of Ch. 16, Section 31 of the Revised Statutes, as amended. Under this Section is the intent that all employees actually inspecting seed potatoes be paid 8¢ per mile for all miles traveled?"

See C. 340-1, P.L. 1957, Sec. 44.

It is our opinion that employees, whose time is substantially spent inspecting potatoes, are entitled to be paid 8¢ per mile for all miles traveled in connection with such inspection.
