Interchange of Information by Departments of Agriculture

We have your memo of Desember 18, 1960 in which you ask for our thoughts on the following motion passed by the Northeastern Commissioners of Agriculture:

"Neved by Alempi and duly seconded by Gill that this association approve interchange of information concerning court decisions, cancellation of licenses and similar formal action taken by the states against cosmodity buyers. This information to be sent to Harold Girth, who will consolidate and distribute it to the states. Each Commissioner to designate one person in each state to forward the state report and receive the report from Girth. This material to be confidential and for state department of agriculture use only. Passed by unanimous vote."

We see nothing hermful in the motion that would parait the various departments of agriculture throughout the country from exchanging information useful to each other.

As your law presently stands, action in respect to licenses is taken in a court, and results of such decisions and other court decisions would, of course, be available to the public in the state of the decision and an exchange of such information would not, in our opinion, violate any right to know law.

Our own association exchanges information on cases which one Attorney General believes to be of interest to the other Attorneys General and we know of no law that would prohibit such interchange.
