Re: L. D. 960 - An Act Creating  
the Town of Kittery Port  
Authority - P. S. C. 163

In response to your oral request we would advise that in our opinion it is proper for the legislature to establish a town Port Authority in the form contained in L.D. 960.

We have examined Chapter 271-A of the New Hampshire laws creating a New Hampshire State Port Authority, and L.D. 960 is essentially a copy of that law.

Another law on our books which created a local body to perform functions of a nature similar to those contained in L.D. 960 is Chapter 192, Private and Special laws of 1917, which law established a Board of Harbor Commissioners for the Harbor of Portland.

We would like to point out that through some inadvertence a few words appear to have been omitted in section 8 of L.D. 960. In line 2 of that section after the word "supervision" the words of the Authority have been left out.

We are returning herewith the pamphlet of rules and regulations promulgated by the New Hampshire State Port Authority.

If you have further questions on the matter we will be happy to discuss them with you at any time.
